Topic: If The Quality Goes In, Do You Need NDT? **Speaker: Larry Cote CET, C.L.S., CMRP**

This presentation will introduce the Canadian Institute for NDE (CINDE), and briefly explain the role it plays as Canada's national society dedicated to the people and companies engaged in the business of non-destructive testing (NDT), inspection and evaluation. An overview of NDT techniques will be provided, along with examples of how they are used in a wide range of industries that will help answer the question: *"If the quality goes in, do you need NDT?"*

Larry Cote - Biography



Mr. Cote graduated from Mohawk College in 1977 with an Honors diploma in Chemical Engineering Technology. His 30 year career at Dofasco included roles as Lubrication Lab Supervisor, Quality Improvement project manager, Senior Reliability Specialist and Team Leader of the Predictive Technical Services department.

Larry is a Past Chair of the Society of Maintenance and Reliability Professionals (SMRP). He helped develop the Society of Tribologists and Lubrication Engineers (STLE) Certified Lubrication Specialist (CLS) and the SMRP Certified Maintenance and Reliability Professional (CMRP) personnel certification programs.

He was an instructor for the Lubrication Fundamentals CE program for Mohawk College from 1991 - 2003, and currently teaches PEMAC Maintenance Management Professional (MMP) modules 1 and 5 through the Northern Lakes College on-line distance learning portal, and Predictive Maintenance Technologies for the Mohawk QET-NDE program.

In his current position as President / CEO of the Canadian Institute for NDE (CINDE), Mr. Cote works closely with the Board of Directors to achieve the goals of the CINDE 2020 strategic plan.

From Niagara or Hamilton East - Take the first exit (North Shore Blvd) at the north end of the Skyway Bridge. Keep to the right, pass the Joseph Brant Hospital and Maple Ave. Turn left at Brock Ave and make an immediate right into the driveway of the Art Gallery of Burlington. Volunteers Needed!!

Volunteers needed for Validation effort on the ISO/DIS 9001

Ms. Anne Wilcock, PhD, University Professor Emerita from the University of Guelph has agreed to lead a validation effort in Canada, on the ISO/DIS 9001 to reject the document and request a DIS-2. The final decision at the international level will depend on responses of other countries.

The major reason for a proposed rejection is failure (at present) from a process perspective, i.e. failure to perform (as per the project plan) a validation of the document. The validation must be performed and issues addressed, prior to advancing the document to the Final Draft International Standard (FDIS) stage, as requests for technical and editorial changes that might come from the validation work are not permitted on the FDIS, in accordance with rules spelled out in the ISO/IEC Directives.

Many participants as possible are needed, but at the same time a balance across all sectors/sizes.
