Driving Directions

Coming from the west (i.e. Dundas):

1. Head east on Main St. W.
2. Turn left onto Cootes Dr.
3. Stay right to take the ramp into the university.
4. Turn right on College Court.
5. Follow College Court which will come to an elbow.
6. Take the first right into the parking lot.
7. You will be parking in "LOT I."
8. Once you have parked, walk east toward the Engineering Technology Building (ETB). It is the building made of glass facing Main St. W. It is beside the Information Technology Building (ITB) and behind the Institute for Applied Health Sciences (IAHS).

Coming from the east (i.e. Central Hamilton, Stoney Creek):

1. Head west on King St. W.
2. Once you cross the 403 access bridge, stay in the lane second from the left.
3. Follow the lane as it turns left.
4. Stay right.
5. Once you see McMaster Children's Hospital, you will want to be second from the farthest right lane.
6. Merge onto CootesDr.
7. Stay right to take the ramp into the university.
8. Turn right on College Court.
9. Follow College Court which will come to an elbow.
10. Take the first right into the parking lot.
11. You will be parking in "LOT I."
12. Once you have parked, walk east toward the Engineering Technology Building (ETB). It is the building made of glass facing Main St. W. It is beside the Information Technology Building (ITB) and behind the Institute for Applied Health Sciences (IAHS).

Coming from the north (Flamborough, Cambridge, Guelph, etc.)

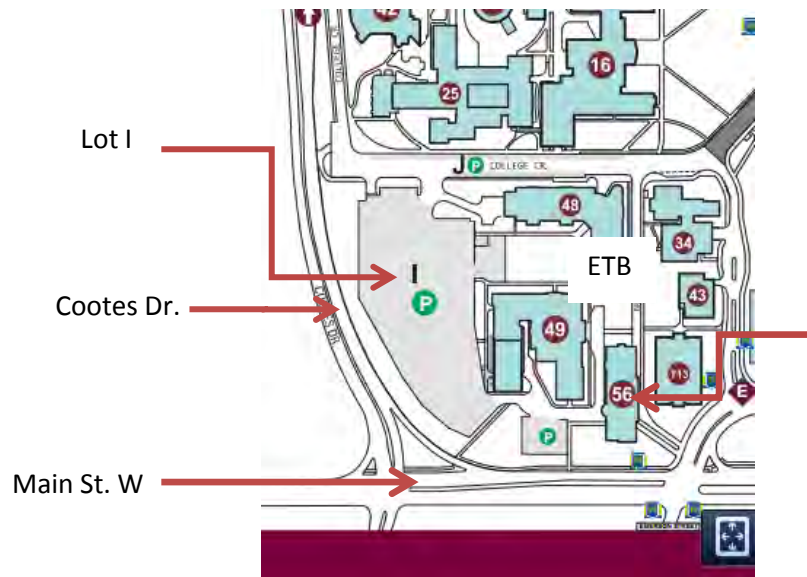
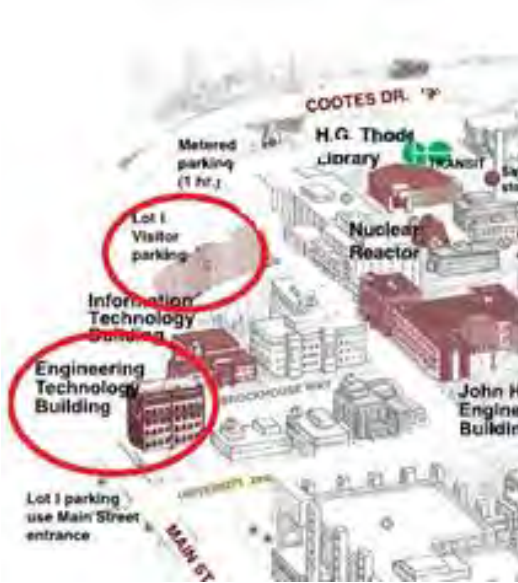
1. Take Hwy 6S to Hwy-403 W.
2. Merge onto Hwy-403 W.
3. Exit 69A for ON-8/Main St. W.
4. Turn left onto Main St. W.
5. Stay right to take Cootes Dr.
6. Stay right to take the ramp into the university.
7. Turn right on College Court.
8. Follow College Court which will come to an elbow.
9. Take the first right into the parking lot.
10. You will be parking in "LOT I."

Coming from the southwest (Brantford):

1. Take HWY 403 E.

3. Turn left onto Longwood Rd. S.
4. Turn left onto Main St. W.
5. Stay right to take Cootes Dr.
6. Stay right to take the ramp into the university.
7. Turn right on College Court.
8. Follow College Court which will come to an elbow.
9. Take the first right into the parking lot.
10. You will be parking in "LOT I."
11. Once you have parked, walk east toward the Engineering Technology Building (ETB). It is the building made of glass facing Main St. W. It is beside the Information Technology Building (ITB) and behind the Institute for Applied Health Sciences (IAHS).

Coming from the Northeast (i.e. Burlington, Oakville)

1. Take the 403 W.
2. Exit 69A for ON-8/Main St. W.
3. Turn left onto Main St. W.
4. Stay right to take Cootes Dr.
5. Stay right to take the ramp into the university.
6. Turn right on College Court.
7. Follow College Court which will come to an elbow.
8. Take the first right into the parking lot.
9. You will be parking in "LOT I."
10. Once you have parked, walk east toward the Engineering Technology Building (ETB). It is the building made of glass facing Main St. W. It is beside the Information Technology Building (ITB) and behind the Institute for Applied Health Sciences (IAHS).
